Ed Wachala presented a program about Polish people who had fought for American freedom. One of the people included in his presentation was:

Casimir Pulaski, Father of the American Cavalry, was the oldest son of Polish Count Joseph Pulaski and born in March. When he traveled to Paris, he met Benjamin Franklin. Franklin convinced him to support the colonies against England in the American Revolution. Pulaski impressed with the ideals of a new nation struggling to be free, volunteered his services.

Franklin wrote to George Washington describing the young Pole as an officer, renowned throughout Europe for the courage and bravery he displayed in defense of his country's freedom. In 1777, Pulaski arrived in Philadelphia where he met General Washington, Commander-in -Chief of the Continental Army.

Later at Brandywine, he came to the aid of Washington's forces and distinguished himself as a brilliant military tactician. For his efforts, Congress appointed him Brigadier-General in charge of Four Horse Brigades. Then again, at the battles of Germantown and Valley Forge, Pulaski's knowledge of warfare assisted Washington and his men. Later in 1778, through Washington's intervention, Congress approved the establishment of the Cavalry and put Pulaski at its head.

Ed finished with trivia questions and candy rewards.

## Program:



Gary Weber presented the program about his position with Ameren (CIPS) and the U.S. power grid. Before his retirement, Gary was a relay technician working at numerous substations and power plants over a large geographic central Illinois area.

A relay is like a circuit breaker. It senses a problem on a line and shuts down the power. The type of lines that Gary worked around carried 360,000 volts of electricity. There are automated monitoring devices that open and close such circuits. Gary also tested, calibrated and installed from engineer plans.

The U.S. electric grid is a complex network of independently owned and operated power plants and transmission lines owned by sixteen grid operators. The U.S. electrical grid is the largest interconnected machine on Earth: 200,000 miles of high-voltage transmission lines and 5.5 million miles of local distribution lines, linking thousands of generating plants to factories, homes and businesses. Overall reliability planning and coordination is provided by the North American Electric Reliability Council.

Midwest Independent Transmission System Operator (MISO) is the grid operator that serves central Illinois as well as several states and the province of Manitoba Canada. They have about 94,000 miles of power lines and are headquartered in Indianapolis.

## March 2011 Board Meeting Highlights

The meeting was called to order at the Red Barn on Friday, March 4, 2011 at 12:10PM by President, Mike Damler, with the following members present: Janet Butler, David Butler, Mike Damler, Kim Higgins, Sherrie Hoel, Tim Hoel, Jaci Manzella, Don Miller, Steve Niemann, Kevin Nolan, Alan Shoemaker, Wayne Ward and Gary Weber.

The following items of business were discussed:

1. February Meeting Minutes – A motion was made and seconded to approve the meeting minutes. Minutes approved.
2. February Monthly Report – A motion was made and seconded to approve the monthly report. Report approved.
3. Treasurer's Report – As of March 4<sup>th</sup>, the checking account balance was \$6,159.06 A motion was made to approve the report. The motion was seconded and approved.
4. Requests for Reimbursement or Budget Requests – Approval was given to reimburse Wayne Ward \$54.76 for trauma doll tags and Legion of Honor pins/certificates.
5. Pancake Breakfast – Gary reported that the net receipts for the event were \$989.54.
6. Tuscola Force Softball Team – Kevin reported that the team does not have any large expenses at this time, therefore a donation to the group was tabled.
7. 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Party – The event will be held at the Red Barn on March 25<sup>th</sup> at 6PM. The TCHS Honors choir will provide entertainment. The price will be \$15.00 per person. The committee is working on the final details.
8. Holiday Meeting Schedule – Since several holidays fall on a Monday, it was decided that meetings would only be canceled for major holidays when members may be traveling.
9. Peace Meals Deliveries – The peace meal coordinator requested that Kiwanis take the month of June. After discussion, a motion was made for the club to deliver meals in June, seconded and approved. Mike will appoint a chairperson for this project.
10. Club Liability Insurance – After discussion the Board decided that the current KI liability insurance was sufficient for the events that the club sponsors.
11. New Member Fees – The current new member fee is \$75.00 with the unwritten understanding that new members are not required to pay the semi-annual dues of \$50.00 if they joined within 3 months of January to July. The cost to the club treasure for each new members ranges from \$20 to \$61 depending upon what month the new member joins. The Board decided to not change the current fee and method.
