The pantry serves the residents of Douglas County. A walk-in refrigerator was recently installed so that the pantry can offer milk and more refrigerated items provided by Tuscola Dollar General at no cost through the Feed America program and Dollar General donated items including shelf items. Most weeks, Kirby Foods provides bread, buns, and assorted baked items at no cost.

In Illinois one out of six children suffer food hunger on a regular basis. In the U.S. 47 million children experience food insecurity. SAM Pantry serves 25-30 fmailies per week. The pantry is open Wednesdays 7:30a-10:00a at the Tuscola United Methodist Church.
