Carol Burwash introduced our speaker, Brian Moody. Brian serves as Tuscola Fire Chief and Director of Douglas County Economic Development Corporation.

Brian reported that Tuscola is a finalist regarding site selection for the former Lyondell/ Basell property. FuFeng USA Incorporated, headquartered in Oak Brook Illinois is part of a worldwide Chinese company that would invest in a \$600 million capital project. It would take three years to build. The facility is expected to purchase 15% of the corn from the seven local central Illinois counties. The corn would be processed to extract amino acids for animal feed markets. When completed, about 240 full-time employees would be employed at the facility.

The Cronus project is not dead, but still moving very slowly.

There has been some interest in the Tuscola Mall. The owners are now ready to sell.

The former Denny's Restaurant has been purchased. The Starlight Diner is expected to open in the next few months.

Janet Butler introduced our speaker, Devin Black, director of the Tuscola Public Library. The Carnegie library was built in 1903.

Seventy-five percent of the library is funded from local property taxes. The remainder of income is from state funding and donations. Total income is \$203,000. Its collection holds 134,640 physical items and has access to over 351,000 electronic items. Over 25,000 items were circulated in 2024.

Program and event attendance has risen since COVID. The library will be starting a new program for pre-schollers called "1,000 Books Before Kindergarten."

The library is planning a program to families to purchase outside pavers that will be placed around the front court bench. The pavers will have book names and look like the spine of a book. Community members will be encouraged to purchase in honor of a person or family, or in memorial of someone. More details to come,
